Pakistan Floods

1. OVERVIEW

Torrential monsoon rains beginning in July 2022 have brought catastrophic flooding and landslides to Pakistan. The floods have caused 1,600 confirmed fatalities, 12,900 injuries, and property and infrastructure damage that has left 7.9 million people displaced. One-third of the country is under water, severely impacting the country's mainstay agriculture industry, with 2 million acres of crops drowned and over 1 million livestock lost.

2. CORE'S RESPONSE

CORE is working with local leaders and partners to address the critical needs of those affected by the floods in the Sindh Province. Its current activities include:

- Providing emergency relief supplies to communities devasted by the flooding, including hygiene kits, mosquito nets, and food
- Coordinating with partners for the rapid rollout of emergency services to the most heavily impacted areas
- Implementing mobile health clinics among villages in the Sindh Province to provide first aid support to those injured by the floods and landslides, and to provide medicine to those impacted by diseases such as malaria and dengue fever

3. ACTIVITIES

Highlights:

September 5

- CORE arrives on ground in Karachi
- CORE meets with local partner, Riverside Development Organization (RDO) to view affected areas in Sukkur
- CORE outlines plan of action with RDO consisting of distributions of hygiene kits, food, mosquito netting, and tents, along with a mobile medical clinic

September 8

- CORE team assesses villages and urban slums affected by flooding with RDO
- CORE connects with Sukkur District Commissioner
- CORE continues procurement process of hygiene kits and mosquito net distribution

September 9

- Teams assemble hygiene kits with local partner RDO
- CORE distributes of 200 hygiene kits and 400 mosquito nets with RDO





Resource Coordination

CORE is distributing the following resources to support those most impacted by the floods and vulnerable populations.

- Feminine hygiene kits
- Mosquito nets
- Dry food

4. NEXT STEPS

CORE's immediate priorities for the response are:

- Assess additional communities that CORE can assist in resource distribution
- Continue to implement procurement and distribution of hygiene kits (focusing on women)
- Implement procurement of dry ration of food to deliver to families in need
- Implement mobile health clinics in 27 villages including supplying common medicines
- Continue to procure and distribute mosquito nets for humans and animals in rural villages
